


# SCA Objectives

## Statutes of the Science Council of Asia (SCA), Article 2

- (1) To provide scientists in all fields, including cultural and social as well as natural sciences and technology, a collaborative platform for promoting scientific exchange and cooperation in Asia for the improvement of human society, and,
- (2) To develop and promote a holistic vision by integrating the emerging advances in science and technology with Asian wisdom, values and heritage, focusing on sustainable development and improvement in quality of life.

# Who We Are & Our History

SCA was established in 2000 and the first SCA conference was held in Bangkok, Thailand, in May 2001. From then on, SCA has been more actively addressing the diverse and urgent issues common to Asian countries and regions to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. SCA is governed by the Management Board which consists of the delegates within each member country/region.



The SCA Secretariat is established at Science Council of Japan to assist the work of the council and the Board, under the leadership of the Secretary General/Treasurer. The General Assembly is held once in two years and Management Board Meeting is held at least once a year.
